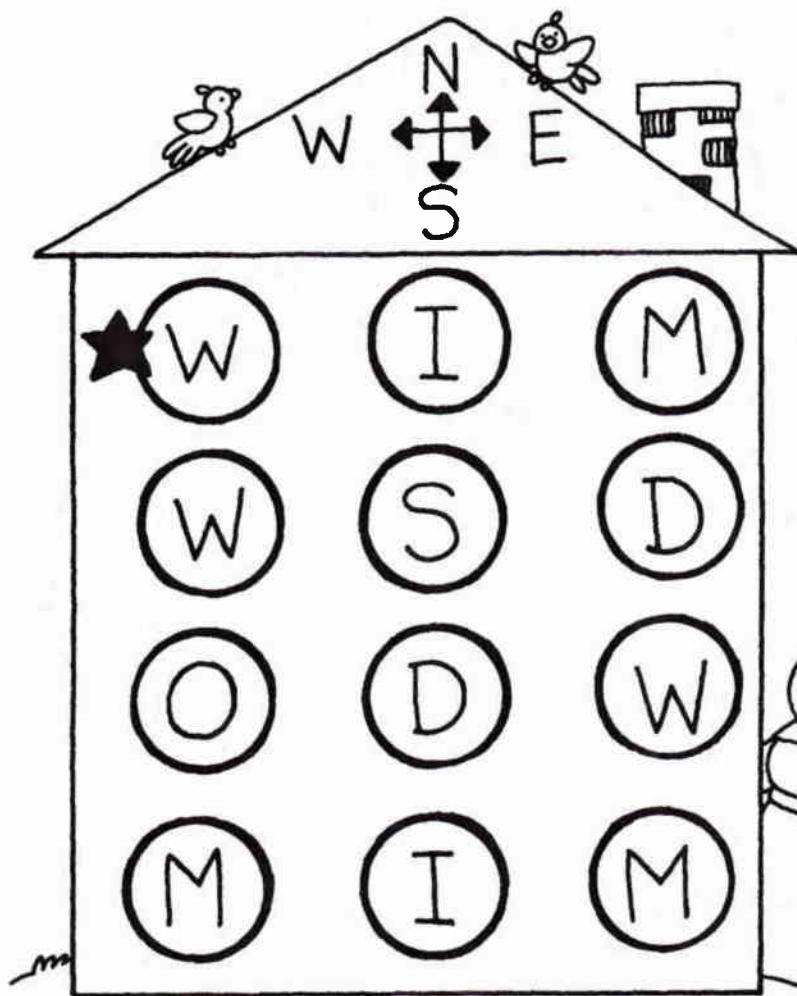

Last Wednesday, August 15, we celebrated the assumption of Mary into heaven.

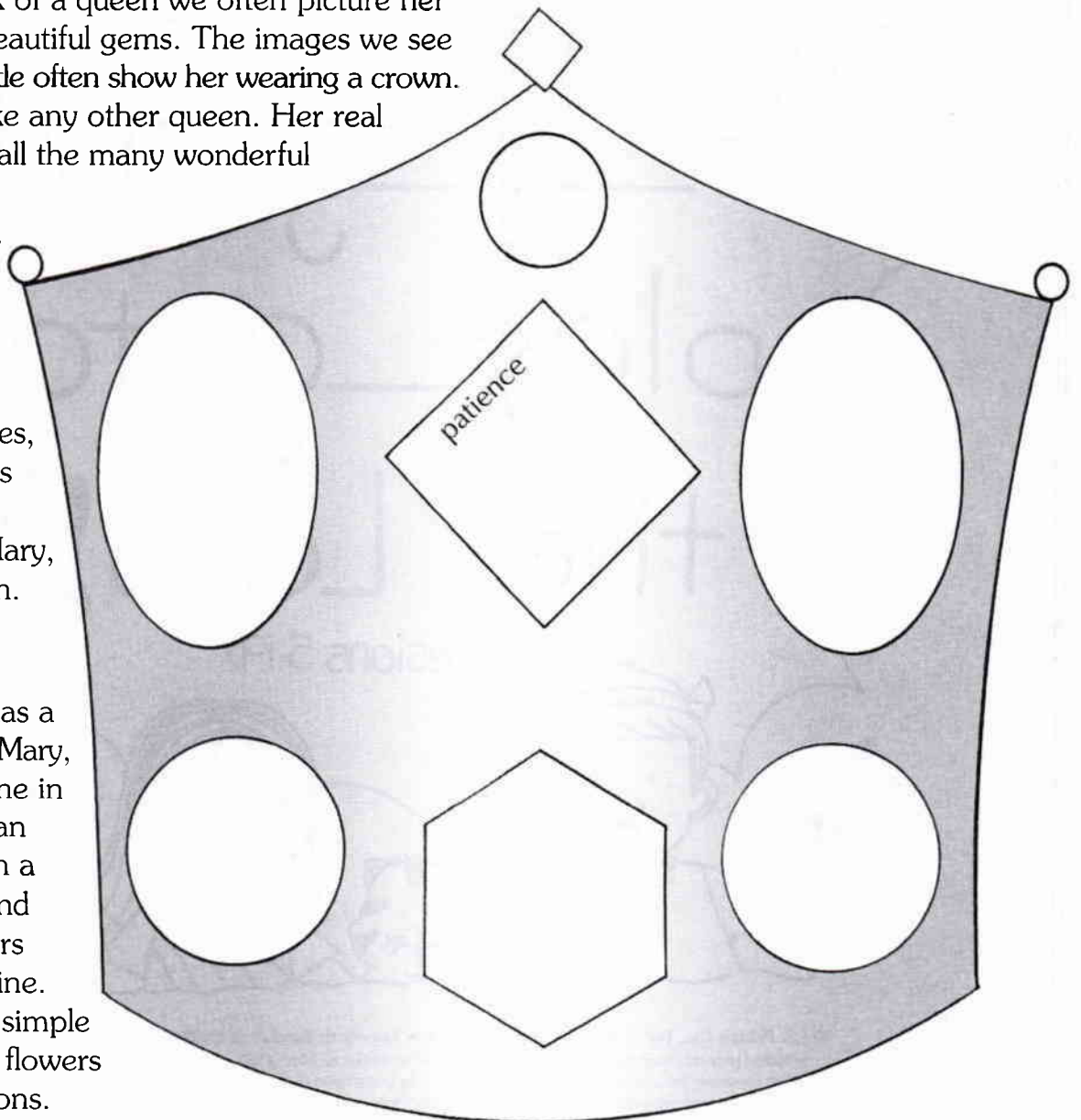
This Wednesday, August 22, we will remember Mary as

“Queen of Heaven”—in Latin, *Regina Caeli*.

When we think of a queen we often picture her with a crown of beautiful gems. The images we see of Mary with this title often show her wearing a crown. But Mary is not like any other queen. Her real crown is made of all the many wonderful things she does as Queen of Heaven.

This crown contains outlines of some jewels. Instead of seeing diamonds and rubies, fill them with words that describe the loving actions of Mary, our heavenly queen. An example is done for you.

If your family has a statue or picture of Mary, create a small shrine in your home. You can place the image on a pretty blue cloth and gather some flowers to place in the shrine. You could make a simple crown using other flowers or paper and crayons.
